## **God's Amazing Transformative Power**



Illusionists can be intriguing as they often seem to perform the impossible, yet for every trick their is a true viable answer to 'how' they were able to accomplish the feat. So once that 'secret' is out the illusion no longer holds the viewer in awe as it once did. But God is not an 'illusionist' dependent on slight of hand or props to accomplish the things He did and does. God is the **real** deal. The ability to 'create' and 'transform' are part of the essence of 'who' He is so making something out of nothing (the universe and our world) or transforming one thing into something else (dust into us, water into wine or tares/weeds into wheat to name just a few) comes as natural to Him as breathing to us.

It is hope invoking to know that God is transforming us as we walk this earth into something beautiful beyond our imagination and that we are not 'stuck/trapped' where we are with what we currently have or are able to get/achieve because for me that would never be enough to be worth living this life for. This world is filled with to much ugliness and sin, though there is also amazing beauty as well, to overcome the pain. But the knowledge that one day soon this world will be transformed back into the 'perfect' creation it once was, before sin and death corrupted it, where we will be free to enjoy and walk with God as Adam and Eve once did is a hope that sustains me thru all that life throws my way. To be able to see God 'create' a new Heaven and Earth when we get to the end of the Bible and the fullness of God's plan is completed will be a blessing we get to watch in awe.

It has been a long held belief for me based on my life experiences that while we walk this world we do so until the completion of the tasks God has for us and then we go home to be with Him (if we have given our lives to Him or to eternal separation from Him if that is our choice). I do not believe that **anything** 'happens' to us by **random** chance but is filtered thru the loving 'hands of God'. (bold emphasis mine) God can redeem anything!! Nothing is beyond His ability or power to achieve so we need to understand that the reality and limitations of our physical life (which Jesus came and endured for the sake of restoring relationship with us and the Father) has no affect on God's ability to fulfill His will and promises to us. We need to come to a place where we are listening to Him, "He says, 'Be still and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." Psalms 46:10

To understand 'who' He is and 'what' He is capable of yet that He is mindful of us and our feeble, sinful condition but still desires for a relationship with us despite all the evil, faithless wickedness we are capable of because who He is transcends this should silence us. It should bring us to our knees and even flat on our faces before Him. We can do it willingly throughout our life out of a heart of gratitude or begrudgingly when we are called before the Lord in Heaven at the Great White Throne judgment. (Rev. 5:13, Phil. 2:10, Romans 14:11, etc.)

Final Thought: We can find peace and hope when we realize that the God who is in control of all things is not an illusionist or fake but the **truth** of a awesome, amazing and loving Creator who turned dust into living breathing flesh and bone, water into wine and sinful lost corruptible beings into beautiful reflections of Him.
