Why Choose God?

This word for love is not used in the Bible.

- Storge (family) Love: Does appear in the Bible but only as 'compound word'. Based on the special 'bond' a family has for example: Rom. 12:10 'Be devoted to one another in brotherly (phileo storge).'
- Agape (love) Love: God's Love. Dispassionate or not based on emotions or friendship but rather is related to 'obedience', obeying God and is related to our love for God and is expressed in action. Defined by action not 'feeling'. Matt. 5:44 'Love your enemies (not saying have a good feeling about them) and **pray** (action) for those who persecute you. Since defined by 'action' and not based on 'feelings' but obey God concerning them. John 3:16 'For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son ...' did God enjoy having His Son die? No, it tore His heart out but it was His 'Agape' (action) love to make a way to restore our lost relationship with Him. 1 John 3:16 'And we know love by this, that He laid down His life for us ...' Again, did Jesus enjoy suffering and dying (action) for us? No but He did so because of His 'Agape' Love for the Father and us.

The reason I believe this **Love** is more valuable than anything you can earn, get or find on this earth is because it is an **eternal** gift that originates beyond our beings and can only be 'received' from the One who is 'Love'. To be 'accepted' for who and the way we are and 'loved' (despite all our imperfections and sins). Then as a result of that 'love' to be willing to make the ultimate sacrifices necessary, span eternity and make a way to have relationship with us is more then we could ever deserve and yet is freely offered and given to us. A love not based on us at all but because of who God is and as a result never changing, always the same for all eternity.
